YOUNG HANDLERS CLASS

AN ENGRAVED MEDAL is presented by the Clydesdale Horse Society following the show to the best young handler who has not already qualified between 1st of May this year and the date of the show. if this is the case then the medal and subsequent qualification for the final will be passed down to the next eligible applicant. The successful applicant will be eligible for the final at the Royal Highland Show in June the following year. Entire colts are not allowed to be used in a Young Handler Class

RIDDEN CLYDESDALE RULES

JUDGING/RIDER

Shows affiliated to the Clydesdale Horse Society should run their Clydesdale Classes in accordance with the society's rules and regulations.

Turnout should be natural, traditional and smart, similar to that worn in a hunter or mountain moorland class.

Above all, riders and grooms must, at all times, present themselves in the show ring neatly and smartly dressed.

HORSES TURNOUT/SHOWING

Black, Brown or Tan tack, clean and well fitting.

Plain bridle with cavesson nose and and plain brow with a snaffle or traditional double/pelham riding bit, No harsh bits, Liverpool driving bits or bitless bridles will be permitted.

All ridden horses should be three years old or over.

Shoeing should be of a traditional nature and indicative of the nature of its use. If bevel shoes are worn, screw in studs must be fitted.

Tail plait and wool and flights optional but for Health & Safety reasons no standing wired flights.

Riders will be required to give a short individual show at walk, trot & canter or set show lasting approximately 2 minutes. Change of rein and lengthened strides in canter at the judge's discretion. Rein back, (optional) and halt.

At all times the rider must be courteous.

Ridden Clydesdale Championship:

This class is a qualifier for the Ridden Clydesdale Championship to be held at Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Thursday 27 August 2026.

The first two CLYDESDALES to qualify. Qualification may go down to fourth place, if horses placed 1st and 2nd have previously qualified. Registered Clydesdales and those eligible for registration may qualify and enter for the Championship.

Caledonian Showing Championships

This show is a qualifier for the Caledonian Showing Championships, which is now fully established as the biggest and best way to end Scottish showing season. This year's show will be held at Howe EC, near Ladybank, Fife on 16/17/18 October 2026. Every horse and pony placed 1st in all In-hand, Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) and Working Hunter/Pony classes will qualify to compete in any appropriate class at the Finals. All Champions and Reserves will qualify for the Champion and Reserves Stakes Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, and no qualification can go down the line. All qualified horses and ponies will be listed on the Puddledub Show's Facebook page and the website <https://puddledubshows.weebly.com/>

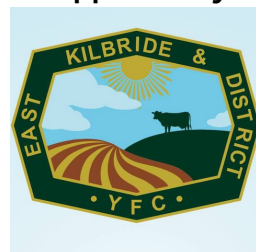

REGULATIONS AND GENERAL CONDITIONS

PARKING OF FLOATS

The directors would respectfully draw exhibitors to the necessity of removing floats to the parking ground immediately animals have been set down.

SHOW DAY REGULATIONS

- 1.Competitions are open and not restricted to members but all competitors must pay the appropriate entry money.
- 2.The ages of animals shall be calculated 1 January except where stated.
- 3.Cattle and horses must be on the show ground and exhibits in the Industrial Section half an hour prior to judging commencing as the judges shall start promptly at the time stated.
- 4.Any cattle doctored will be liable to disqualification. The veterinary inspector and committee reserve the right to examine cattle 3 days after the show. The decision of the veterinary inspector and committee shall be final.
- 5.Cattle and horses must remain on the show ground until after the parade and exhibits in the industrial section in the tent until 4pm.
- 6.Three people are admitted with one animal. For any additional animal, one person per animal is allowed.
- 7.Entries will be accepted on the Showfield however showjumping and showing can be pre-booked for cheaper entry online on Entrymaster.
- 8.Should the number of exhibits entered in any class only equal or be less than the numbered of prizes offered for competition, the directors may retain the first and any other prizes.
- 9.In the event of any misdemeanour or breach of the show day regulations, the directors reserve the right to take such action as they deem appropriate.
- 10.Any complaints must be lodged with the secretary in writing before the grand parade.
- 11.The decision of the directors on all matters adjudicated upon by them shall be final.
- 12.Classes, entry money and prizes may be altered by the directors at their discretion without notice. .
- 13.All prize winning animals must attend the parade.

RULES

- 1.Exhibits will be received in the tent on Showfield from 8.00am on show day. All exhibits must be in place by 10.00am and remain there until 4pm.
- 2.Judging will commence as stated in the schedule. The judges' decision is final.
- 3.The society will not be liable for loss or damage from accident or otherwise. Every precaution will be taken however to protect all exhibits.
- 1.The show will be opened to the public after 9am
- 2.In the event of a tie for cups, competitors gaining most 1st prizes would qualify for the cup or trophy

ANIMAL AND PLANT HEALTH AGENCY REGULATIONS

Animals moving to shows for exhibition for the first time will not have to be kept separate prior to moving to the show irrespective of whether any other livestock have been moved onto those premises in the 13 day period immediately before moving. If attending only one show within any one 13 day period, the animal will not require to be held separately on return from the show nor will the return home trigger a 13 day standstill for any other animals on the home farm. Animals may move from show to show or may return to their usual premise of residence without triggering a 13 day standstill provided they are kept in separate facilities under an authorised separation agreement with SGRD. In all case the standstill period for pigs is 20 days.

The Transport of Animals (Cleansing and Disinfection) (Scotland) Regulations 2005 applies to vehicles taking animals to and from a show/exhibition.

HEALTH STATUS: SUMMARY (SCOTTISH GOVERNMENT)

- Any animal coming from a Scottish holding must have a negative herd status for BVD or be individually tested negative for the BVD virus.
- Any animal from a 'non negative' herd cannot move to a show unless it has been individually tested negative for the BVD virus.
- Any animal coming from outside Scotland should either be from a BVD CHeCS accredited herd or be individually tested negative for the BVD virus
- Exhibitors must be a members of Holstein/UK and the Society reserves the right to pregnancy diagnose any females where awards are made.

IDENTIFICATION CATTLE

Cattle born after 1.1.1998 must have a Defra approved ear tag in each ear (double tagging). The tag in each ear must have the same unique number. Such animals will be identified throughout their lifetime by this unique number. Animals born or imported into Britain before 1.1.1998 may continue to be identified by a single tag. Cattle born after 1.7.2000 must be identified by all numeric tags.

When an animal moves on and off a showfield, the steps below should be followed.

1.Exhibitor reports the movement off the holding.

2. Show secretary reports the movements on and off the within 3 days of the show. Exhibitors must bring documents to the show for each animal:

- A cheque book style passport (CPP13) or
- A single page passport (CPP52) or
- A certificate of registration (CVHR3) or
- A certificate of registration and a blue/green passport (CPP1) If the passport movement summary is full, a continuous sheet should be attached.

SHEEP AND GOATS

Sheep born after 31.12.2009 require a full EID, two identifiers one of which must be electronic. The EID can be contained in a tag, a bolus (an identifier in a container that is swallowed and stays in the animal's stomach) or a pastern tag (band around the animal's lower leg). Sheep identified for slaughter under 12 months of age require a single electronic slaughter tag which contains the flock number only.

Goats are required to be double tagged.

Sheep and goats born after 18.1.2008 and before 31.12.2009 must be identified with 2 means of identification (2 official ear tags or 1 ear tag and 1 tattoo or solely, in the case of goats, one official ear tag and a stern tag) bearing the same number. Older animals born prior to 18.1.2008 and not already officially identified are now also subject to double identification. However, in the case of animals being born prior to 9.7.2005, this will only apply when the animals are moved off the holding.

MOVES TO SHOWS

A movement document must be complete for each show showing the number of animals moved at batch level. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to report these moves to the Scottish Animal Movement Unit (SAMU) in Dumfries. Stock may be inspected at shows in order to satisfy disease control measures.

SHEEP AND GOATS HEALTH SCHEME REGULATIONS

Maedi Visna/Caprine Arthritis Encephalitis Accreditation Scheme

The show will arrange verification of the MV and CAE Health Status Reports prior to unloading. The MV/CAE report must be:

- Fully completed and valid
- The expiry date must be later than the date of movement and within all dates of the show
- Signature and date to be valid
- Ear tags of all sheep
- Up to 20 animals can be listed on one report

PRIZE LIST

Competitors are requested to note that the ownership of all cups, shields or other trophies unless won outright by a competitor in accordance with the rules of the society, rests with the society, and that holders of such cups, shields or trophies are responsible particular cups, shields and trophies from time to time, as the society may consider necessary.

POINTS AWARDED FOR TROPHIES 1st – 4 points, 2nd – 3 points, 3rd – 2 points, 4th – 1 point

Any animal which has already won a trophy may compete again for the same trophy and in the event of the trophy awarded to it, the owner of the animal will have his name inscribed on the trophy, but this will not be qualification towards winning the trophy outright

EQUINE RULES

- All riders must always wear protective head gear when mounted with the chin strap properly fastened. Head gear must conform with the current 2019 standards, which can be found on www.bhs.org.uk or in the BRC rule book.
- Back protectors are recommended, especially for children.
- Exhibits are at owners' own risks. The society is not responsible for loss or damage by accident or otherwise with in the showground.
- All vehicles must be parked as directed by the stewards.
- No mistreatment of animals at this show will be tolerated. All horses/ponies must be in sound condition. The judge has permission to ask a competitor to leave class if horse/pony looks to be un-sound or un-well.
- All horses/ponies must always be kept under control in the designated horse areas. Any showing to be a danger in the show field may be asked to leave.
- All colts and stallions must be handled by an adult 18yrs+
- All horses must be accompanied by their passport and be available for inspection. Horses/ponies vaccinations must be up to date to enter and compete on the show field.
- Directors reserve the right to cancel, combine or split classes under certain circumstances.
- Trophies/shields must be signed for before being allowed to collect them. These MUST be handed back in time for the next year's show.
- Any complaints must be lodged with the secretary on the day of show with a £10 deposit. This must be followed by a written confirmation of complaint within none week of the show. Deposit is forfeited if protest dismissed.
- Judges/stewards/directors are not held responsible for competitors missing classes. All competitors must be vigilant for their upcoming classes. If a clash of classes is going to occur, please inform a ring steward so that a place in that class can be held.
- There are no refunds for missed classes.
